Message from the Director

Hello East Calgary,

We hope you are staying warm. Welcome to our Spring edition. The printing business has changed dramatically in the last six months, and we have found ourselves with a new printer. I hope this finds you well and you don't even see a difference.

We hope you've had a chance to look at our new website (12csi.ca), we are proud of it and full of resources for you and your community.

Say Hi to the purple people when you see them around International Avenue. They are there to help all people in the community. We hope you like the new look!

We have been working with some of our community groups on a Security Infrastructure grant from the province, in hopes our communities can be more prepared.

In the fall, I attended a Cyber Security Summit hosted by the Calgary Police Service. I learned much about the latest online threats and prevention strategies. We must think of the Cyber world as a parallel world and put in safety measures and guardrails just like our physical world. You wouldn't just open your front door and let a stranger in,

and we must be just as vigilant with online contact. Much work in our society to do, there!

I attended a Calgary Police one day summit this month and was updated on what is going on in Calgary with prevention, victim assistance and support that we have in this City. Safer Calgary is a collaboration between the City Emergency management and Community Safety department, Calgary City Police and Calgary Transit safety. The Community Engagement Response Teams (CERT) have had an impact on our city. From April 1, 2024 to February 12, 2025 they have dealt with 10, 869 calls with 1235 charges laid and 6,165 arrests made. 389 Navigation Centre referrals (for vulnerable Calgarians) and 211 Community Court references (Possible diversion from Criminal court).

Have a look at all of the activities and advocacy that your Community Associations are doing in the coming pages. We encourage you to get involved in your community






